At this time, we do not plan to accept any more international students for the 2014 – 2015 school year. For 2015 – 2016, we plan to interview and host as many as twelve international students, depending upon enrollment guidelines. MACA has already started the process of promoting our school through these two organizations. If you have any questions, general interest, or would like to host an international student, please contact me. Our goal is to identify families for hosting by late February in order to accommodate international interest in our school. MACA's goal is to influence our local community; however, reaching the entire globe for Christ is wonderfully rewarding and exciting for the staff and students here at MACA.

On another note, I hope all parents have seen the field maintenance project on the east side of the property. We are very close to seeding the field which should be ready for use next spring. One family graciously pledged an amount up to \$3,000 to fund the project. Two other families gave \$1,000 and another \$500. With the unexpected purchase of top soil, our \$3,000 to \$4,000 project turned into an \$8,000 project. We are now looking for another \$2,500 to complete the funding for the field. I fully expect this to be one of our many focal points to attract families to our school especially at the younger ages. While the middle school and varsity teams should be able to practice on the field, I can already envision our Mighty Lions soccer teams playing next fall with parents, students and concessions. Please prayerfully consider giving \$100 or more to complete the funding for this project.

I praise God each and every day for our parents, our students and our faculty. This school year is off to a great start. I am proud to be a MACA Lion along with each and every one of you!

When asked why she loves teaching, Mrs. Hammond replied, "I believe that God has ordained a special purpose for each of us to fulfill. I take seriously the opportunity to shape the minds of impressionable children, to delight them with the ways their heavenly Father cares for them; how He has even numbered the hairs on their heads, clothed the lilies of the field, and keeps His eyes on the sparrows. I believe that when His Word sinks into a student's heart, everything changes. I teach in an effort to reflect His glory. This is Mrs. Hammond's eighteenth year at MACA. She grew up in Maugansville, MD with her sister and two brothers. After high school she attended Messiah College in Grantham, Pennsylvania, where her major was nursing. She later enlisted in the U.S. Navy as a Hospital Corpsman while attending the Naval School of Health Sciences. After earning a degree as a cytotechnologist, she worked at Balboa Naval Hospital in San Diego, California, and at Bethesda Naval Hospital in Maryland. (A cytotechnologist screens cells under the microscope for

abnormalities and cancer.) After fulfilling her commitment to the Navy, she worked for SmithKline Beecham Clinical Laboratories for the next ten years. Realizing her God-given calling was to teach, she left the cytology field to finish a degree in Christian Education at Trinity College of the Bible. She is currently working on her Master's degree in Literacy and Curriculum Development.

Mrs. Hammond has three sons and one grandson. Three year old, Ryland, loves to fill her weekends with joy and laughter. All of her sons attended MACA and she considers it a great privilege to give back to the ministry that the Lord used to give so much to her family.

As well as being involved with a ministry to the elderly at Lorien (an assisted living/nursing facility), Mrs. Hammond is a Children's Church teacher. She also travels to South Africa each year to serve as a missionary/educational assistant for an orphanage (Dumisani) and to train teachers at a newly opened Christian school (Kingdom Kids).

When Mrs. Hammond isn't teaching she delights in being "cheerleader" at her boys' baseball games (GO NAVY! BEAT ARMY!), surprising her husband with a home-cooked meal, putting lessons together for her students to enjoy and finding a quiet moment to read a devotional classic or taking a walk and reflecting on all the blessings that God has poured upon her. She also loves to journal.

Mrs. Hammond has chosen Ephesians 3:20 as her life verse:
