She spent most of her childhood with her nose firmly stuck in a book.

In her senior year of high school, her younger brother had a heart attack and her oldest sister was diagnosed with leukemia. This inspired her to study science in college in the hopes of becoming a doctor. Three semesters into her college education, she realized her medical goals had become something of an idol to her and she decided to move toward a career in education. She graduated from the University of Maryland with a degree in Biology and began teaching at Christian schools soon thereafter. Ten years later, she is still teaching and loving it more and more every year.

She is married to MACA Bible teacher, Patrick Korn, and together they are raising their three living children to love Christ and value life. Bo just started kindergarten at MACA and loves it. Maggie Jake (3) wants to say her favorite colors are pink and purple and Joe (9 months) is just starting to take his first independent steps. In 2012, they delivered a daughter, Luna, stillborn.

She has suffered quite a few major losses recently - losing a brother, a daughter, a sister and her father in
