Three MACA Alumni Head to the NCAA Division III Championship Tournament Friday, March 4, 2016, 5:30 P.M.

Three alumni from MACA will head to the NCAA Division III Basketball Championship as part of the Lancaster Bible College Chargers Men's Basketball Team. Lancaster Bible College's men, currently undefeated at 27-0, will take on the College of Wooster (21-7) from Wooster, Ohio during the first round of the 2016 NCAA Division III Men's Basketball Tournament on Friday, March 4, at 5:30 p.m. Lancaster earned the appearance in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history after winning the NEAC Conference championship last weekend – also a first in school history.



Representing MACA on the chargers team is Nick (MACA class of 2011), Jimmy Eagan (MACA class of 2012) and Emmitt Miller (MACA class of 2015). Monroe and Eagan were also members of the first team to win a men's varsity basketball conference at MACA in 2011. Miller was a member of the MACA men's varsity basketball team that made it to the 2014 NCSAA Division II National Tournament Final.
